June 8 – Depart USA

June 9 - Paris, France

Arrive in Paris, romance capital of the world. Transfer from the airport in Paris to your ship.* After boarding, take free time to explore Paris, or join our “welcome walk” and get oriented. (D) Note: The Paris port authority assigned Viking a docking location in Le Pecq, a western suburb of Paris. To help maximize your time in the city center, we are offering complimentary shuttles for Viking guests throughout your stay.

June 10 - Paris, France

After breakfast, embark on a tour of this dazzling city and marvel at its most remarkable sights, including the iconic Eiffel Tower. Take in the École Militaire, Orsay Museum and Latin Quarter, and magnificent Notre Dame Cathedral. Then we’ll drive past the Louvre and Opera House and along the famed Champs-Élysées. Return on board for dinner and start your cruise (B, D)

June 11 - Vernon, France

Arrive in Vernon before breakfast; take a short ride into the town of Giverny, where Claude Monet resided from 1883 until his death in 1926. Visit the beautiful gardens and charming stone farmhouse where he lived and worked; see the water garden with the recognizable Japanese bridge, water lilies, wisteria and azaleas that inspired many of his masterpieces. After lunch, spend some time with Program Director in the provincial town of Vernon. Take a stroll to see the Maison du Temps Jadis (House of Past Times), Vernon’s oldest house, and the 11th-century Church of Notre Dame. Dinner on board. (B, L, D)

June 12 - Rouen, France

Indulge in leisurely morning cruising along the Seine. Spend the afternoon in the medieval city of Rouen, preeminent capital of Normandy. Begin with a walking tour through the center of Old Town, where you see the spectacular Gothic Notre Dame Cathedral, often painted by Claude Monet, and the famous Gros Horloge, a 16th-century astronomical clock. As you walk among the half-timbered storybook buildings, allow yourself to be transported back through time; see the 14th-century courthouse where Joan of Arc was sentenced to death and the nearby Market Square where she was martyred.

Use your free time to discover more of Rouen or visit one of its museums of art or antiques. Dine on board or at a sidewalk café. Your ship remains docked overnight. (B, L, D)

June 13 - Normandy Beaches

After breakfast, begin your full-day tour to the historic beaches of Normandy. Drive past Gold Beach, Courseulles sur Mer and Juno Beach on your way to visit such World War II landmarks as Omaha Beach, the American Military Cemetery and Arromanches Debarkment D-Day Museum. Alternatively, you may take a tour of Bayeux, where you can admire the magnificent tapestry that chronicles the pre-Battle of Hastings events. Afterward, continue to Normandy’s coast and enjoy some free time at Juno Beach after your visit to the museum; then visit the Pegasus Museum. Return to your ship for dinner and relax on board, or take an evening stroll through Rouen. (B, L, D)

June 14 - Les Andelys, France

Enjoy a leisurely morning cruise to the small town of Les Andelys, known for its imposing castle, Château Gaillard, built in 1196 by Richard the Lionheart. After lunch, join a guided walk to this fatally flawed masterpiece of Middle Ages architecture before returning to your ship. (B, L, D)

June 15 - Paris (Le Pecq), France

After breakfast, disembark for a visit to Chateau de Malmaison, where Napoleon Bonaparte spent his final days in France. Along with the Tuileries, this elegant manor house, purchased by the emperor’s wife Josephine in 1799, served as the seat of Napoleon’s French government from 1800 to 1802. Or, join an optional tour to the luxurious Palace of Versailles, former home of Louis XIV. (B, L, D)

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June 16 - Paris, France

After breakfast, disembark and proceed to the Paris airport for your return flight. Or, extend your time in France’s romantic capital with a 3-night Paris extension. (B)

Day 1 Paris: Transfer to the First-Class Pullman Paris Eiffel Tower Hotel (or similar). The rest of the day is yours. A Viking host is available to help you plan your time in Paris so you can make the most of your visit.

Day 2 Paris: After breakfast, enjoy a guided walking tour of Paris and take in the sights of this dazzling city. Spend the afternoon and evening at your leisure—consider visiting museums like Musée D’Orsay or experience the world-famous Louvre, home of da Vinci’s Mona Lisa, The Winged Victory of Samothrace and I.M. Pei’s iconic glass pyramid. (B)

Day 3 Paris: You have a full day to further explore the “City of Light.” Stroll through Montmartre, shop along the Champs-Élysées, ride up to the top of the Eiffel Tower and sample some of the famous French cuisine. You might like to take a Seine cruise on board a bateau-mouche this evening to see some of the city’s landmarks and lovely bridges. (B)

Day 4 Paris: After breakfast, check out of your hotel and we will take you to your ship to begin your river cruise. (B)

Day 1 Loire Valley: After breakfast, disembark your ship and begin your ride through the French countryside. Our first stop is the city of Chartres. Once the capital of the Celtic tribe of Carnutes, it became an important pilgrimage site during the Middle Ages. Today, it is also known as the capital of perfume. But the highlight of the city is the Chartres Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This well-preserved 12th-century cathedral is a remarkable example of Gothic architecture and the site of King Henry IV of France’s coronation. Free time to explore the city further or to have lunch on your own. Continue to the village of Vouvray for a tour and tasting in a wine cave cellar, then proceed to the First-Class Château de Beauvois for a 2-night stay. Enjoy an included dinner at your hotel. Your Viking Tour Director is available to help you plan your time so you can make the most of your visit. (D)

Day 2 Loire Valley: After breakfast, set off on a guided tour of Château Chenonceau, one of the world’s most beautiful estates. The grand castle, built beside the Cher River in the 16th century. The last French sovereign to stay in Château Chenonceau was Louis XIV in 1650. The house has been relatively well cared-for, and after serving as a hospital for wounded soldiers during World War I, it has been completely restored, including the lovely formal gardens. Complete the day with a guided exploration of Tours including the main cathedral and some of the city’s many parks and bridges. Free time for dinner before returning to your hotel. (B)

Day 3 Loire Valley: After breakfast, check out of your hotel and drive to Château de Chambord. Built in the early 16th century by Francis I, a great admirer of Leonardo da Vinci, the structure is reminiscent of the Tuscan style, centered around a magnificent double spiral staircase. The château was later greatly expanded by Louis XIV and today features hundreds of apartments and an elaborate rooftop terrace offering panoramic views of its vast parklands. Free time for lunch before continuing on to Orléans, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This city’s long history includes everyone from the Druids, Gauls, Romans and Attila to the famous “Maid of Orléans,” Joan of Arc. During the Renaissance, the area became a fashionable location for châteaux and the University of Orléans achieved great prestige. When France colonized part of North America, they honored Orléans by naming a certain city La Nouvelle-Orléans, or New Orleans. See some of the city’s sights, including the university, the botanic garden and Joan of Arc’s childhood home (now a museum). Following your excursion, travel to Paris for your overnight stay in the First-Class Hotel Rochester Champs Elysées (or similar). (B)

Day 4 Paris

After breakfast, check out of your hotel and proceed to the airport for your return flight. (B)
